LOCAL RULES

TO BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE RULES OF GOLF

1. OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 27-1)

a) Those areas beyond the course boundary fences.

b) Beyond any line of white stakes with black tops.

c) Beyond the concrete wall adjoining the club property.

d) Beyond the black line surrounding the Clubhouse and the Golf Shop.

2. GROUND UNDER REPAIR (RULE 25)

a) Those areas the margins of which are defined by white stakes and/or white lines.

b) Areas marked with yellow stakes and/or white lines.

c) Areas marked with red stakes and/or white lines.

d) Areas marked with red stakes and/or white lines.

3. GROUND UNDER REPAIR - PLAY PROHIBITED

These penalties are identified by white stakes. Note: All other planted areas are an integral part of the Course from which the ball must be played as it lies or declared playable in Rule 25.

4. EMBEDDED BALL

Through the green, a ball which is embedded in its own pitch mark in the ground may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as

possible to where it originally lay in the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course through the green.

5. STAKED TREES AND SHRUBS

If a staked tree or shrub interferes with the player's stance or area of intended swing, the ball MUST be lifted without penalty and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-1(b) (Immovable Obstruction). Note: If the staked tree lies in a water hazard, the ball must be dropped in the water hazard or the player in an adjacent water hazard.

Note 2: The stakes are an Immovable Obstruction.

6. WATER OR LATERAL WATER HAZARDS (RULE 26)

Some hazards are defined by yellow stakes and/or lines. Lateral Water Hazards are defined by red stakes and/or lines. Note: The stakes are Immovable Obstructions.

7. ROADS AND PATHS (RULE 24-2)

Artificially surfaced roads and paths (including gravel) are immovable Obstructions. All other roads and paths that are not artificially surfaced are integral parts of the course from which the ball must be played as it lies or declared playable in Rule 25.

8. FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS

All fixed sprinkler heads and top covers are immovable obstructions. If a

ball lies through the green and such an immovable obstruction on or within two club lengths of the putting green and within two club lengths of the ball interferes on the line of play between the ball and the hole, the player may take relief as follows:

The ball shall be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay that is not nearer the hole. Obstacles of any kind, and not in a hazard or in a putting green. The ball may be cleaned when so lifted.

9. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES (DMD)

A player may obtain distance information by using a DMD that measures distance only. If, during a stipulated round, a player uses a DMD that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (e.g. gradient, wind speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of Rule 15-1, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.

10. MOBILE PHONES

Mobile Phones may be used. Inappropriate use may be considered a serious breach of etiquette.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULES

Stroke Play - 2 strokes / Match Play - Loss of hole

Mobile Phone Rule - 0 stroke / 0 equalizer

FLAG PLACEMENTS (CHECKERED): Red/White - Front Blue/White - Middle Black/White - Back Tick box to enter Matchplay / Trophy Event
