

LOCAL RULES

3. BE FEAID IN CONCORDANCE WITH THE RULES OF GOLF

OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 27-1)

These areas beyond the course boundary limits

Beneath any line of white stakes with black tops.

Beyond the concrete wall adjoining the club property.

Beyond the black line surrounding the Clubhouse and the Golf Shop.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR (RULE 25)

Those areas the margins of which are defined by white stakes and/or white

Flags. Note: Stakes defining GUR are removable Obstructions.

Except in a hazard, clearly defined wheel marks and/or ruts made by a

motor vehicle or motor vehicle.

GROUND UNDER REPAIR - PLAY PROHIBITED

Those areas defined by white stakes. Note: All other planted areas

are integral part of the Course from which the ball must be played as it

is or declared unplayable (Rule 25).

EMBEDDED BALL

On the green, a ball which is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the

pitch-mark may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as

possible to where it lay but not water the hole. The ball whose disposal must

be decided by a player of the course through the green.

5. STAKED TREES AND SHRUBS

If a staked tree or shrub interferes with the player's stance or area of

swing during the ball MUST be lifted without penalty and disposed in

accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b Obstruction

Obstruction. Note 1: If the staked tree lies in a water hazard, the ball must

be dropped in the water hazard if the player may proceed under Rule 25.

Note 2: The stakes are removable Obstructions.

6. WATER & LATERAL WATER HAZARDS (RULE 24)

Water Hazards are defined by yellow stakes or other lines. Lateral Water

Hazards are defined by red stakes and/or lines. Note: The stakes are

removable Obstructions.

7. ROADS AND PATHS (RULE 24-2)

Artificially surfaced roads and paths (including grass) are removable

Obstructions. All other roads and paths that are not permanently surfaced

are integral parts of the course from which the ball must be played as it

is or declared unplayable (Rule 25).

8. FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS

All fixed sprinkler heads and top covers are removable obstructions. If a

ball lies through the green and such an removable obstruction is within

two club-lengths of the putting green and within two club-lengths of the ball

at address on the face of play between the ball and the hole, the player may

take relief as follows:

The ball must be lifted and disposed of in the nearest part of the hole

by the ball or in the nearest hole. The ball must be cleaned, marked and

placed on a putting green. The ball may be cleaned whenever WCC.

9. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES (DMD)

A player may take a distance measurement by using a DMD of measure

distance only if, during a regulated round, a player uses a DMD that is

designed to gauge or measure other dimensions that might affect his play

(e.g., yardage, or aligned, topographic, etc.). The player is allowed to Rule

14-1, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any

such additional function is actually used.

10. MOBILE PHONES

Mobile Phones may be used. Improper use may be considered an excess

breach of etiquette.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULES

Stroke Play - 2 strokes / Match Play - Loss of hole

Mobile Phone Rule - Disqualification
