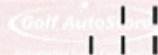

## LOCAL RULES

BE READ IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE RULES OF GOLF

## OUT OF BOUNDS (RULE 27-1)

These areas beyond the course boundary fences.

Beyond any line of white stakes with black tops.

Beyond the concrete wall adjoining the water property.

Beyond the black line surrounding the Clubhouse and the Golf Shop.

## GROUND UNDER REPAIR (RULE 245)

Those areas the margins of which are defined by white stakes and/or white lines.

Note: Stakes defining GUR are removable obstructions.

Except in a hazard, it is only defined when marks or other signs made by a member, tractor or motor vehicle.

## GROUND UNDER REPAIR - PLAY PROHIBITED

One penalty stroke is deducted by white stakes.

Note: All other ground areas are integral parts of the Course from which the ball must be played as if it were declared unplayable (Rule 28).

## EMBEDDED BALL

If, through the grass, a ball which is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the sand may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped as near as

possible to where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike as part of the course through the grass.

## 5. STAKED TREES AND SHRUBS.

If a staked tree or shrub interferes with the player's stance or area of intended swing, the ball MUST be lifted without penalty and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b(3) (Unmovable Obstructions, Note 3). If the staked tree lies in a water hazard, the ball must be dropped in the water hazard if the player may proceed under Rule 26, Note 2. The stakes are removable obstructions.

## 6. WAIVER OF LATERAL WATER HAZARDS (RULE: 245)

Water Hazards are defined by yellow stakes and/or lines. Lateral Water Hazards are defined by red stakes and/or lines. Note: The stakes are removable obstructions.

## 7. ROADS AND PATHS (RULE 24-2)

Artificially surfaced roads and paths (including gravel) are removable obstructions. All other tracks and paths that are not artificially surfaced are integral parts of the course from which the ball must be played as if it were declared unplayable (Rule 28).

## 8. FIXED SPRINKLER HEADS

All fixed sprinkler heads and tap covers are immovable obstructions. If a

ball lies through the green and such an immovable obstruction is or within two club lengths of the putting green and within two club lengths of the hole, the player may take relief as follows:

The ball shall be lifted and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay that is not nearer the hole, is not in a hazard, and is not in a bunker or on a putting green. The ball may be cleaned before or after.

## 9. DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES (DMD)

A player may obtain distance information by using a DMD that measures distance only. It is not a prohibited device, a player using a DMD that is designed to give or assess or other conditions that might affect his play in a hazard, wind speed, temperature, etc. The player is in breach of Rule 4-4, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional function is actually used.

## 10. MOBILE PHONES

Mobile Phones may be used. Improper use may be considered a serious breach of etiquette.

## PENALTY FOR BREACH OF LOCAL RULES

Stroke Play - 2 strokes / Match Play - Loss of hole

Mobile Phone Use - Disqual. Stroke
